Trustee Schimel moved, duly seconded by Trustee Zeedyk to approve the minutes of the previous Regular Session of the Board of Trustees held on Tuesday, November 17, 2009.

Trustee Mares moved, duly seconded by Trustee Morelli, that the bills, approved by the various committees of the Board, be approved for payment, and to approve warrants which authorizes the Village Treasurer to draw checks to pay the bills, to be signed by the authorized signers, as provided for by the Ordinances of the Village of Stickney.

Trustee Lazansky moved, duly seconded by Trustee Schimel, to approve the payment of Engineer's Payment Estimate No. 5, Street Rehabilitation Phase 2 for \$338,400.37 to Orange Crush.

President O'Reilly declared the motion carried.

President O'Reilly informed us that there is a final payment on Phase 2 which is due next year. If there are any final changes or corrections, a "punch list" of the project that need to be done prior to the final payment.

Trustee Walik moved, duly seconded by Trustee Schimel, to approve the Appropriation of \$60,200 of Motor Fuel Tax funds for the Purchase of Road Salt which includes a resolution of Maintenance of Streets and Highways by a Municipality Under the Illinois Highway Code."

President O'Reilly declared the motion carried.

Treasurer Kaznicka explained the details of the tax levy that represents a 10.13% increase. It includes no increase for the General Fund, Police Pensions 2.48%, Bond and Interest at 7.65%, which is the second year for the increase for the 2008 series of the \$6.4 million in bonds which were issued for street improvement. In subsequent years there will be a nominal increase. Trustee Schimel commented that he wished he knew that his vote on the 2008 bond would have created this double-digit tax levy we are now facing.

Trustee Walik moved, duly seconded by Trustee Mares, to pass and approve Ordinance 2009-30, "An Ordinance to Amend Motor Vehicles and Traffic by adding another one-way street."

CLERKS REPORT: The clerk reported on the 2010 Census

TRUSTEE REPORT:

Trustee Walik expressed his thanks for all those who helped in the collection for the troops. There was 1785 pounds of donated items collected.

Trustee Zeedyk gave the police report for the month of November. There was 928 total calls, E911 calls 133, E911s dispatched 53, 911 non- emergency 80, total arrests 716, miscellaneous details and investigations 1464, 14,033 miles, 1230 gallons of gasoline, and 11.409 mpg.

Ordinance investigations 65, business license investigations 4, violation notices 31, miscellaneous

Ordinance investigations 65, business license investigations 4, violation notices 31, miscellaneous details 25, SOLs -0-, and 115 adjudication hours.

Trustee Zeedyk announced that our Engineer Tim Geary is back after having a heart transplant.

DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS:

Fire Chief Larry Meyer announced the new fire engine will be in active service this Friday. There was no turkey fires reported. He reminded people of Holiday safety issues.

Deputy Chief Frank Figueroa informed us that there was an incident November 25 at the Jewel Store. A person was cutting himself with a knife. The subject put the knife to his own throat when the police arrived. The police found the need to tazer the person to subdue him. The person was taken to MacNeal where he was put on suicide watch. In addition the department responded to bar fights in Lyons.

Joe Lopez, Supervisor of Public Works, reminded people of the year-long street sweeping in the Village. We were told to remember to check out the street signs to refresh our memories about street cleaning and snow removal.

AUDIENCE QUESTIONS:

Doris Helebrandt, 6528 41st Street inquired on whether a permit is needed for the installation of a water heater. Trustee Schimel responded that they should. Mrs. Helebrandt further supposed her question by asking if a water heater broke on a weekend what should be done. Trustee Schimel considered it an emergency and the village should be called in after the installation for an inspection.

Penny Gibas of 4425 S. Wisconsin questioned the police contract negotiations. Attorney Stanley Kusper informed her that the negotiations were still ongoing. Mrs. Gibas inquired about the October 28, Police & Fire Commission meeting. In addition, Mrs. Gibas wanted to know if the Entertainment Ordinance allowed lingerie shows. It was suggested that she look at the entire ordinance to see the explicit definitions of what can't be allowed, including lingerie shows.

Bea Callahan of 4126 S. Grove had questions pertaining to the Federal Stimulus Funds. She was given details.

ORDINANCE NO. 2009-33

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 86, "UTILITIES," OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, ILLINOIS BY THE REVISION OF SECTION 86-101 AND THE ADDITION OF SECTION 86-104.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, A HOME RULE UNIT OF GOVERNMENT AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipality in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village implemented a program to install radio meters for water usage in all residences within the Village in 2005 (the "Radio Meter Program"); and

WHEREAS, under the Radio Meter Program, the Village has installed radio meters in 90% of the its residences; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to complete the implementation of its Radio Meter Program; and

WHEREAS, the Village has deemed it necessary to establish certain time requirements and incentives to ensure that radio meters are installed in all residences within the Village by March 31, 2010; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

- **Section 1. Recitals.** The facts and statements contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.
- **Section 2.** Adoption. Chapter 86, of the Municipal Code of the Village of Stickney shall be amended by the revision of Section 86-10, and the addition of Section 86-104, which will read as follows:

Section 86-101. Generally.

All premises using water from . . . until such meter can be installed, or no water shall be furnished to such premises. All newly installed water meters in Village residences shall provide radio readings that can be detected by Village radio meter-reading equipment. Failure to install a radio water meter shall subject a property owner to the penalties set forth in Section 86-104, below.

Section 86-104. Radio Meter Program.

- (a) Property owners in residences without a radio water meter must schedule a date with the Village for replacement of their water meter with a radio water meter, to occur by or before March 31, 2010. Properly scheduled replacements, consistent with the time-frame set forth in this Section, will be made by the Village at no cost to the property owner. All residences must have a radio water meter by March 31, 2010.
- (b) A property owner who fails to comply with this Section shall be subject to a fine of up to \$500.00. In addition, the property owner's residence will be subject to discontinuation of water service, and the property owner will be responsible for any and all costs related to the discontinuation and reinstatement of water service.
- **Section 3. Home Rule.** This ordinance is enacted under the Home Rule powers of the Village as set forth in the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois.

If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or portion of this Ordinance is for any reason held invalid or unconstitutional by any court of competent jurisdiction, such portion shall be deemed a separate, distinct, and independent provision and such holding shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.
- **Section 7. Certification and Publication**. The Village Clerk of the Village of Stickney shall certify to the adoption of this Ordinance and cause the same to be published in pamphlet form.

ORDINANCE NO. 2009-34

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER 86, "UTILITIES", ARTICLE I, SECTION 86-6, (3) OF THE ORDINANCES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, A HOME RULE UNIT OF GOVERNMENT AS FOLLOWS:

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipality in accordance with the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney maintains certain regulations of buildings and construction within the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney wishes to be in compliance with the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District and based on information recently received from the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District it has been determined that mandatory provisions and mandates contained in the previous ordinance be deleted and new provision substituted; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRESIDENT AND THE BOARD OF TRUSTEE OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS.

Section 1. Recitals. The facts and statements contained in the preambles to this Ordinance are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Ordinance.

Section 2. Adoption. Chapter 86 Article I, Section 86-6 "Downspouts," of the Municipal Code of the Village of Stickney shall amended Paragraph (b), (c), and add (d), and (e)which will read as follows:

Section 86-6. DOWNSPOUTS

- (b) All new construction that includes roof drainage, gutters or downspout construction shall include the disconnection of any existing roof drainage, gutters, or downspouts from the private sanitary sewer service. The disconnection of these existing drainage systems from the sanitary sewer service shall meet the requirements of the Building Department such that storm water infiltration is adequately restricted.
 - (c) All new roof drainage, gutters or downspouts shall be constructed to:
 - 1) Discharge to grade to such that the storm water discharge does not negatively impact neighboring properties.
 - 2) Discharge to a system of below grade drain pipes and surface outlet structures that discharge to pervious areas within the subject property limits such that the storm water discharge does not negatively impact neighboring properties.
 - 3) Discharge to a separate storm sewer that is to be connected to the combined sewer located in the public right of way.
- (d) A site plan showing the proposed storm water drainage including downspout locations, below grade drains and storm sewer information shall be submitted to the Building Department as part of the permit application for review and approval. The site plan shall be prepared to scale and include all dimensions, elevations, and other information as required by the Building Department to facilitate their review.

- (e) Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall be subject to punishment as provided in Section 1-9 of this Code. In addition to assessing such penalties, a court of competent jurisdiction shall have the authority to enjoin the party to cease violations under this Section and to take actions as are necessary to correct any violation of this Section of which he is guilty and to remedy the effects of any such violation.
- Section 3. Home Rule. This ordinance is enacted under the Home Rule powers of the Village as set forth in the Constitution and laws of the State of Illinois.
- Section 4. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall be in full force and effect after passage, approval and publication in the manner provided by law.

Section 5, Conflicts. This Ordinance supersedes all ordinances or parts of ordinances directly conflicting with the terms and provisions contained herein, but only to the extent of such conflict.

Section 6. Severability.
