**Upon the roll call, the following Trustees were present: Trustees White, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Absent: Trustee Savopoulos** 

Trustee Hrejsa moved, duly seconded by Trustee Kapolnek to approve the minutes of the regular board meeting held on Tuesday, March 5, 2024.

Upon the roll call, the following Trustee voted: Ayes: Trustees White, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Absent: Trustee Savopoulos

Mayor Walik declared the motion carried.

Trustee Milenkovic moved, duly seconded by Trustee White to Approve Ordinance 2024-02, "An Ordinance Amending Chapter 2, Section 2-178 of the Municipal Code, Village of Stickney, Illinois Regarding Village Officers and Appointing a Specific Individual to a Specified Position."

Upon the roll call, the following Trustee voted: Ayes: Trustees White, Milenkovic, Torres, Kapolnek and Hrejsa Absent: Trustee Savopoulos Mayor Walik declared the motion carried. <u>MAYOR'S REPORT:</u> The mayor thanked everyone for coming out. Today we went to the senior luncheon. It was amazing. He thanked them for inviting us and then offered the Village's help in anything they need help with. He welcomed his grandkids at the meeting.

<u>CLERK'S REPORT:</u> The Clerk reminded everyone that needs to, to fill out their Ethics Statement. It has been delivered to your email boxes. Quite a few people have already filled it out. It is due May 1. She will keep reminding them.

#### TRUSTEE REPORTS:

<u>Trustee Milenkovic:</u> He informed us that there will be fifteen trees for the tree lottery. There will be two additional trees for the schools.

<u>Trustee Torres</u>: She announced that they are planning the Cinco De Mayo fest on May 5, 2024, Sunday from 2:00 to 7:00.

<u>Trustee Kapolnek:</u> The Breakfast with the Easter Bunny at Saint Pius was well attended.

<u>Trustee Hrejsa:</u> This Saturday is the Easter Egg Hunt at noon on Ridgeland. It is a new location on Ridgeland. Sign up for it. We will welcome anybody. He thanked the senior club. It was a nice luncheon today.

#### **DEPARTMENT REPORTS:**

<u>Public Works Director Joe Lopez:</u> He reminded us that street sweeping starts on Sunday, April 1, 2024. We have not had a lot of snow, so we have been cleaning the alleys again this year. We have also started to do the sidewalk grinding again this year. The Village bought us a grinding machine and some other tools. They have been focusing on sidewalks around the two schools and the churches. If someone sees a sidewalk that needs to have grinding, just let him know. He then told us a joke.

<u>Deputy Chief Chlada:</u> On behalf of Chief Sassetti, who is taking a much-needed vacation, he thanked the Mayor and the Board for their continued support of the police department and for their approval of a replacement for Deputy Chief Figueroa. Your support makes our job easier.

<u>Deputy Chief Mark Kozelka:</u> Concerning street sweeping, he wanted to remind people to move their cars. The people started placing reminders on the cars, so it will not be a shock in two weeks. The mayor said we will place an alert on Facebook and the website.

Watch Commander Kevin McGuire: He thanked the Board. Tonight, now we have seven officers manning our streets. He said that it was unheard of. The mayor remembered when he was on the street there, we two of us on the street. Then he referred to an occurrence he recently came across at the Shell and there were six officers and the K-9 backing up each other.

<u>Fire Chief Jeff Boyajian:</u> He thanked the Senior Club for lunch today. He offered his assistance with anything they needed. He then thanked the Board for everything they did for the fire department.

# Stickney Fire Department 2023 Annual Report

The Stickney Fire Department mission statement was read. The power-point presentation included pictures of each apparatus used in the Fire Department. We have a 2022 Ford Type 1 Ambulance; 2015 Ford Type 1 Ambulance which is the backup; 2007 HME Engine with a pumping capacity of 1250 GPM NS 1000 Gallon Water Tank; 2009 Ford F350 utility truck; The newest addition is a 2023 Tracker UTV all terrain four-by-four. It can be used as a special event vehicle, utility/carry all, maintenance and patient transport. It also has a plow to help with maintenance for the fire department. In addition, they have a MABAS light trailer. It can be used for Village events or at emergency scenes when MABAS/Homeland Security has a request for it. It was used during Covid when they used it for lighting a tent. The next focus was on new equipment purchased and upgrades for the firehouse from a grant they received from The Illinois Department of Commerce and Economic Opportunity in the sum of \$150,000. They purchased nineteen sets of new Firedex turnout gear (\$3,700 apiece) which included coats and pants through the IDCE grant. In addition, they obtained new equipment which included 2.5 inch quick-attack nozzles and a 4inch ground monitor/deck gun. Lifting air bags of various capacities were also acquired at a price of \$9,000. Now both our engines have airbags. A Kodiak Stabilization kit was added. It is designed to stabilize objects such as a car or machinery, may move while rescuers who are working to remove a patient from entrapment. This IDCE grant also allowed the remodeling of the 22-year-old fire department kitchen. Lastly, one of the three furnaces and air conditioning units that services an area of the fire station was replaced. The unit that was replaced was an original unit from when the fire department was built in 2002. One was replaced in 2017.

Sixty percent of our calls are EMS ambulance calls. That is the direction the fire service has gone more towards EMS. The Fire Chief sees that number increasing. We have gone up approximately one hundred calls per year.

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Fire prevention: They are out doing inspections now. We added two new inspectors to assist Deputy Chief Silvera. They are inspecting businesses in town, the apartment buildings and all the industry on the east side of town. We acquired new software called FLOW MSP. The inspectors take pictures of the outside and inside of businesses. Any information on hazards is noted. Pertinent information such as the alarm panel locations, sprinkler connections, riser locations as well as hydrant locations near the building.

Training in classrooms or hands-on-training is done on the 1st and 3rd Wednesdays and Thursdays. Pictures of training classes were shown.

The fire department is heavily involved with the community. They regularly attend Home and Edison school's field days to spray water on the kids. In addition, they assisted Home School with the distribution back packs that were obtained through a grant. They assisted at the Stickney Haunted Hayride.

Within one year we should have a new fire truck. On April 8 & 9 we will be going over the specifications with the company.

Chief Boyajian thanked everyone for their support.

There being no further business, Trustee White moved, duly seconded by Trustee Kapolnek that the meeting be adjourned. Upon which the Board adopted the motion to adjourn at 7:29 p.m.

# A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING AND APPROVING A CERTAIN PURCHASE OF ROCK SALT FROM THE STATE OF ILLINOIS FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS

WHEREAS, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

**WHEREAS,** the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and resolutions and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and to review, interpret and amend its ordinances, resolutions, rules and regulations; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities") are committed to ensuring the general welfare of the Village and its residents; and

WHEREAS, the State of Illinois, Department of Central Management, (the "State") is planning to solicit bids for rock salt in bulk for ice control 2024-2025 winter season. The State has invited the Village to participate in the solicitation for the Joint Purchase Master Contract(s) for Rock Salt with a one (1) year term (the "Agreement"), incorporated herein by reference; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities, upon the recommendation of the Village staff, have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to participate in the Agreement and to execute all documents related to the Agreement, including those supplemental documents attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A; and

**WHEREAS,** the President is authorized to enter into and the Village Attorney (the "Attorney") is authorized to revise the Statement and any related agreements for the Village making such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Attorney;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

**SECTION 1: RECITALS.** The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Resolution are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Resolution.

**SECTION 2: PURPOSE.** The purpose of this Resolution is authorize and approve of the Village's participation in the Agreement, to authorize and approve the execution of all documents related to the Agreement, and to further authorize the President or his designee to take all steps necessary to carry out the terms and intent of this Resolution and to ratify any steps taken to effectuate those goals.

**SECTION 3: AUTHORIZATION**. The Board hereby authorizes and directs the President or his designee or the Public Works Supervisor to approve and sign the Agreement and any other relevant documents from the State in accordance with its terms, or any modifications thereof, and to ratify any and all previous action taken to effectuate the intent of this Resolution. The Board

further authorizes and directs the President or his designee to execute the Agreement with such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Attorney. The Village Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to attest to and countersign any other documentation as may be necessary to carry out and effectuate the purpose of this Resolution. The Village Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary. The officers, agents and/or employees of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the Village to carry out, give effect to and consummate the purpose of this Resolution and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. To the extent that any requirement of bidding would be applicable, the same is hereby waived.

**SECTION 4. HEADINGS.** The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Resolution are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Resolution nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Resolution.

**SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.** The provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Resolution be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

**SECTION 6. SUPERSEDER.** All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

**SECTION 7. PUBLICATION.** A full, true and complete copy of this Resolution shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

**SECTION 8. EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval as provided by law.

# A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING, APPROVING AND RATIFYING AN AGREEMENT WITH ELECTRICAL SOLUTIONS NETWORK FOR THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COUNTY OF COOK, STATE OF ILLINOIS

**WHEREAS**, the Village of Stickney (the "Village") is a home rule municipal corporation in accordance with Article VII, Section 6(a) of the Constitution of the State of Illinois of 1970; and

**WHEREAS**, the Village has the authority to adopt ordinances and to promulgate rules and regulations that pertain to its government and affairs, and may exercise any power and perform any function pertaining to its government and affairs; and

WHEREAS, Commonwealth Edison ("ComEd") administers the Energy Efficiency Program (the "Program"), which grants incentives to communities based on the reduction of energy consumed for lighting and other electrical power uses; and

WHEREAS, the Village President (the "President") and the Board of Trustees of the Village (the "Village Board" and with the President, the "Corporate Authorities"), being committed to reducing the Village's energy usage and energy related costs have determined that it is in the best interests of the Village and its residents participate in the Program; and

WHEREAS, the Village desires to engage the services of a contractor to replace existing fluorescent and HID lighting with new LED products and services at Village Hall, the Police Station, the Fire Station, and the Public Works Facility to achieve these goals (the "Services"); and

WHEREAS, Electrical Solutions Network ("ESN") has provided a contract (the "Contract"), attached hereto and incorporated herein as Exhibit A, which generally sets forth the terms, covenants and conditions under which ESN will provide the Services to the Village; and

WHEREAS, the Corporate Authorities have determined that it is necessary, advisable and in the best interests of the Village and its residents to enter into and approve contracts with substantially the same terms as the terms of the Contract; and

**WHEREAS**, the President is authorized to enter into and the Village Attorney (the "Attorney") is authorized to revise contracts for the Village making such insertions, omissions and changes as shall be approved by the President and the Attorney;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE PRESIDENT AND BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE VILLAGE OF STICKNEY, COOK COUNTY, ILLINOIS, as follows:

**SECTION 1: RECITALS.** The facts and statements contained in the preamble to this Resolution are found to be true and correct and are hereby adopted as part of this Resolution.

**SECTION 2: PURPOSE.** The purpose of this Resolution is to authorize the President or his designee to enter into the Contract whereby ESN will provide the Services to the Village, to authorize the President and the Attorney to make such insertions, omissions and changes as

necessary, and to further authorize the President or his designee to take all steps necessary to carry out the terms and intent of this Resolution and to ratify any steps previously taken to effectuate those goals.

SECTION 3: AUTHORIZATION. The Village Clerk is also authorized and directed to affix the Seal of the Village to such documentation as is deemed necessary. The officers, agents and/or employees of the Village shall take all action necessary or reasonably required by the Village to carry out, give effect to and consummate the purpose of this Resolution and shall take all action necessary in conformity therewith. To the extent that any requirement of bidding would be applicable to the Services, the same is hereby waived.

**SECTION 4: HEADINGS.** The headings of the articles, sections, paragraphs and subparagraphs of this Resolution are inserted solely for the convenience of reference and form no substantive part of this Resolution nor should they be used in any interpretation or construction of any substantive provision of this Resolution.

**SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY.** The provisions of this Resolution are hereby declared to be severable and should any provision of this Resolution be determined to be in conflict with any law, statute or regulation by a court of competent jurisdiction, said provision shall be excluded and deemed inoperative, unenforceable and as though not provided for herein and all other provisions shall remain unaffected, unimpaired, valid and in full force and effect.

**SECTION 6: SUPERSEDER.** All code provisions, ordinances, resolutions, rules and orders, or parts thereof, in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby superseded.

**SECTION 7: PUBLICATION.** A full, true and complete copy of this Resolution shall be published in pamphlet form or in a newspaper published and of general circulation within the Village as provided by the Illinois Municipal Code, as amended.

**SECTION 8: EFFECTIVE DATE.** This Resolution shall be effective and in full force immediately upon passage and approval as provided by law.
