Please be mindful and watch your speed when driving on Village streets and through alleys. Unless posted otherwise, the Village wide residential speed limit on streets is 20 mph. Additionally, I just want to remind our residents that as of April 1st, street sweeping has begun. This means that you should be following the respective street sweeping signs on your block to avoid being issued a parking citation. Our goal is to attain clean streets and **NOT** issue parking citations. However, to assist Public Works in their effort to clean the streets, we need vehicles moved and issuing parking citations to vehicles in violation of the signage is our primary enforcement mechanism so please obey the street sweeping signs on your block to avoid being issued a parking citation.




FIRE CHIEF JEFF BOYAJIAN

As the winter weather comes to an end and the warmth of spring approaches, I would like to stress the importance of having Smoke Detectors as well as Carbon Monoxide Detectors in your home as they may one day save your life.



Smoke Alarms: Test smoke alarms at least once a month using the test button. Make sure everyone in the home understands

the sound of the smoke alarm and knows how to respond. The Illinois'





Carbon Monoxide Alarms: Test carbon monoxide (CO) alarms at least once a month using the test button. Replace them if they fail to respond when tested. The sensors in CO alarms have a limited life. Replace the CO alarm according to manufacturer's instructions or when the end-of-life signal sounds. Never ignore a CO alarm when it sounds. Get outside immediately and call 911 from a fresh-air location. Carbon monoxide detectors are required within 15 feet of sleeping spaces.

Vehicle Stickers and Pet Tags on sale May 1st-June 30th, 2021



APPLICATION FEES:

Passenger Car - \$20.00

Senior Citizen, Veterans and disabled are FREE.

Trucks - fee will vary depending on plate/registration.

Pet tags (dogs/cats) - \$5-neutered, \$10 not neutered.

- If you are adding a new vehicle you will need to bring in your Illinois Secretary of State vehicle registration form for the vehicle you are adding.
- Your Pet must have a current rabies vaccine number and expiration date to obtain a pet license
- Late fees will apply if stickers and pet tags are not purchased by June 30th, 2021.

Village Hall will be open from 8:00a.m. – 6:00p.m. during May and June for vehicle sticker sales.
